Good luck at college, Nate...you're going to do amazing things!







Troop 200's Newest Arrowmen

Troop 200 scouts **Phil LaBelle, Cameron Lutz, John Martoccia,** and **Owen Maslanka** were recently inducted into scouting's National Honor Society, the Order of the Arrow at Ockanickon Scout Reservation in Pipersville, PA.

Last spring, these scouts were elected by their peers within the troop and recognized as being scouts who live the Scout Oath and Law in their daily lives. There are several requirements to be eligible for the OA, including having spent 15 nights camping as a scout.

Arrowmen can often be found working on projects around camp and they are also often the leaders of their units working to improve the scouting experience for all the members of their unit.

You may have seen scouts wearing a bright red arrow on a crisp white band but wondered what it is. That's the OA sash, an outward sign that the person wearing it is a member of the Order of the Arrow.

Tips for hiking & camping near bears

Bears are active in almost all parks in our region. In recent weeks, bears have been making recurring appearances at several shelters in Harriman, including the popular Fingerboard Shelter. What's the reason? Food! Bears are more likely to seek out human food sources in the spring, when natural food is scarce, and in the summer, particularly during periods of drought.



- Never Approach or Surround a Bear Bears aggressively defend themselves when they feel threatened or cornered. Be especially cautious around cubs as mother bears are very protective.
- Do Not Throw Your Backpack or Food Bag at an Approaching Bear This practice will only encourage bears to approach and "bully" people to get food.
- Use Noise to Scare Bears Away Yell, clap or bang pots immediately upon sighting a bear near your campsite. Never run from the bear. If you feel threatened, back away slowly.
- Avoid Walking Trails at Night Stay in your campsite to avoid chance encounters.
